## **Background**

Living Sky School Division (LSKYSD) may enter into agreements with external organizations, such as First Nations and other school divisions, in which LSKYSD provides safe and reliable transportation for students of other organizations. This procedure outlines the requirements of these agreements.

## Scope

This procedure applies to agreements in which LSKYSD agrees to provide transportation to students either attending non-LSKYSD schools or being brought to LSKYSD schools.

## **Roles & Responsibilities**

The superintendent of business is accountable for the financial feasibility of proposed agreements and is responsible for signing agreements.

The transportation specialist is responsible for determining whether agreements are operationally feasible before they are signed and is accountable for the successful implementation of the agreements that are signed.

### **Definitions**

**Agreements** – legally binding contracts for service whereby LSKYSD is providing transportation for students of external organizations

**External Organizations** – any organization, agency, or entity that contracts LSKYSD to provide transportation of students

#### **Procedures**

- 1. Any agreement must include details about:
  - a. conditions of the agreement;
  - b. processes in place to ensure proper implementation of the agreement, and
  - c. clear expectations of roles and accountabilities of both parties to the agreement.
- 2. Fees shall be set based on actual costs to the division. These costs can include, but are not limited to:
  - a. operating costs of busses;
  - b. maintenance and servicing of busses;
  - c. direct and indirect personnel costs;
  - d. training and professional development of drivers, and
  - e. administrative costs.
